The Castle







The Castillo de Viñuelas is located within the municipal area of Madrid, occupying its north-western extremity, within the protected natural area of Soto de Viñuelas, which forms part of the Regional Park of the Upper Manzanares Basin.

The Castle



The Castillo de Viñuelas, with its earliest references dating back to 1285, is the most notable building on the estate. The current structure dates from the 18th century and has a square plan, with four large cylindrical battlemented towers rising at each corner.

The building has three storeys, except for the towers, which rise to four. Its northern façade displays the greatest artistic and ornamental features: a central upper panel incorporating a coat of arms, a continuous balcony on the first floor supported by columns forming a portico, and two turrets topped with spires. Inside, the Armoury Hall stands out.

The attics are crowned with Gothic cresting and gargoyles, while the walls feature niches with statuary and ornaments originating from the medieval Church of San Francisco in the Segovian town of Cuéllar.


Inside the Castle, now roofed with ribbed vaults and illuminated by chandeliers adorned with crystal drops, are rooms decorated with portraits of former dignitaries. French stone fireplaces bearing heraldic coats of arms warm the salons, which are further enhanced by brilliant tiled wainscoting.





Inc Estate





A privileged setting. The estate covers an area of 3,028 hectares. It borders Tres Cantos and Colmenar Viejo to the north, San Sebastián de los Reyes to the east, the Valdelamasa estate and San Sebastián de los Reyes to the south, and other lands of Madrid and Tres Cantos to the west.

It is enclosed by a 42-kilometre perimeter wall, built largely of dry stone masonry, with the same characteristics as the wall surrounding the Monte de El Pardo.

Three streams (Viñuelas, La Parrilla and Valdelamasa) run through the estate. In addition to these, numerous seasonal ravines traverse the land, creating landscapes of singular beauty and natural interest (Barranco de Labradores, Valdealeas, de la Reina, del Fraile, de la Fuente de Tena, among others).

The estate also benefits from numerous springs, which provide water for wildlife and livestock for much of the year. The holm oak woodland is preserved across most of the estate, with only a few areas lacking this tree cover, complemented by ash trees, junipers, and rockrose thickets.

Our commitment



We have identified new areas specifically suited to red-legged partridge shooting, creating a wide variety of drives across ideal ground of holm oak and cork oak reforestation. A traditional organisation centred around the Castillo de Viñuelas includes:

Our driven partridge shoots date back to the late 19th century, with King Alfonso XIII practising and beginning to celebrate the red-legged partridge drive in the Viñuelas hills at the dawn of the 20th century.
